Hall (The Africa Channel, BET), Nikita Adams (Folding Chairs Prodns/Warner Bros, Paradigm) and Ayanna Lonian (Amazon Prime)The session will provide valuable insights from industry experts regarding strategies focused on nurturing and promoting African talent

and content on the international stage. The panel will also delve into the opportunities available and the innovative approaches required to embrace them to drive growth in this arena while engaging the Black Diaspora.

On September 7th, TAC will be hosting a semi-final judging event in Cape Town, Africa for the **2023 International Emmy Awards** in conjunction with the **International Academy of Television Arts & Sciences**. A crucial step in the judging process, semi-final rounds help determine the 2023 International Emmy Award Nominees. The actual awards will be presented at the 51st Annual International Emmy Award Gala in New York City on November 20th.

Remarked TAC's Reddy, "Through our participation in these prestigious events, The Africa Channel - the longest-running linear television network presenting African content to North American audiences - is once again shining a klieg light on its unwavering commitment to raising the profile of creators and producers from Africa and the diaspora globally."
